

Cultivation Licensing Pathway

Guide to LSA Documentation

WHAT?

Cannabis cultivators applying for or renewing a cultivation license with the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) must receive appropriate Lake and Streambed Alteration (LSA) documentation from CDFW. Appropriate LSA documentation will vary if you are applying for a new cultivation license or renewing an existing license.

WHY?

CDFW requires an LSA Agreement when a project activity may substantially adversely affect fish and wildlife resources. LSA Agreements provide actions to avoid and minimize adverse impacts and provide protections to California's fish and wildlife resources.

HOW?

- 1. Register for an Environmental Permit Information Management System (EPIMS) user account
- 2. Select the Notification type that fits your project:
 - Self-Certification: Strictly indoor grows within a permanent structure
 - General Agreement: Streamlined, pre-written agreement
 - Standard Agreement: Unique and specific for each project
- 3. Submit Notification through EPIMS
- 4. Receive appropriate LSA documentation
- 5. Apply for or renew your DCC license
