## Plant Voucher Collecting Permit Application

## California Department of Fish and Wildlife

Plant voucher collecting permits are issued to authorize individuals to collect and confirm the identity of rare, threatened, endangered, and candidate plants found during botanical field surveys, and to make scientific collections of rare, threatened, endangered, and candidate plants for accession to approved herbaria. Plant voucher collecting permits expire after three calendar years. To apply for a plant voucher collecting permit please complete this form and submit it as directed below.

Additional authorization is needed to conduct any other scientific, educational, or management work requiring the possession or use of rare, threatened, endangered, or candidate plants such as seed or tissue collection, propagation, or research. Please contact the Native Plant Program if interested in conducting any such work.
